Description: During this Staff Development Day, a gourmet lunch is provided for the administration, faculty and staff as an expression of gratitude for another wonderful year. This is an opportunity for many parents (especially those of 8th grade graduates) to show their gratitude, one final time, towards those who have meant so much to our children for so many years. The PTO provides financial and volunteer support for this event.

Faculty Gift Giving - The PTO is honored to sponsor and support two faculty gift giving campaigns annually. The first takes place in December and is referred to as the **Holiday Gift** and the second takes place in June and is known as the **End of Year Gift**. Both gift giving campaigns are spearheaded by our Homeroom Parent volunteers in accordance with certain guidelines that have been set forth by the PTO. These guidelines consist of the following: Both gift giving campaigns are monetary (cash) in nature **ONLY**. Even though it is suggested that each family contribute at least \$25 to each drive, participation is strictly voluntary. Money collected is then divided (in accordance to PTO guidelines) amongst the faculty members that care for and nurture your children each and every school day. Gifts will be placed in either a Holiday or Thank You card containing the signatures of **ALL** class/grade members. Cards will then be presented to each teacher on the last day of school prior to winter recess and again on the last day of school.

Teacher Appreciation Week – May 4-8, 2020

Each year, Pen Ryn's PTO proudly sponsors this amazing week where the ones who we entrust with the safety and welfare of our children throughout the school year are shown our appreciation and gratitude. Again, this event is organized by our classroom parents who collaborate with their homeroom families to ensure that each teacher is presented with at least one token of appreciation each day during the course of this week. Some of the guidelines governing this event include: Cash is *not* to be gifted for this event, however, gift cards may be presented. When signing up, *please* be as specific as possible with your intentions so gifts are not duplicated. Each gift is presented *NOT* from a specific student or family, but from the entire class or grade.

ADDITIONAL VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE 2019/20 SCHOOL YEAR

Lunch Volunteers - Pen Ryn is always looking for lunch-time help. If interested in assisting with this plentiful and on-going need, please see Angela Stanley in the front office. This is also a perfect opportunity for extended family members to assist with volunteer hours on behalf of their Pen Ryn family.

<u>Homeroom Parents</u> - Each Pen Ryn homeroom teacher requires the assistance of at least one homeroom parent throughout the school year. These parents work directly on behalf of and are supported by the Pen Ryn PTO. During Back to School Night, each homeroom teacher will have available a written description of what the position entails along with a sign-up sheet. At the end of the evening, each homeroom teacher will select one or two names to fill the position. As a precursor, the following are the primary duties of a homeroom parent:

1. Meeting the needs of the homeroom teacher. This USUALLY involves organizing and purchasing for holiday parties (all purchases are eligible for reimbursement with a receipt through the activities fund. The school office manages this fund, so receipts should be submitted there for reimbursement.) But, on occasion, the teacher may request your assistance with a special project the class is involved with (i.e. Once Upon a Lilly Pad, Renaissance Day, Mother's Day Breakfast, State Fair, etc.)

2. Ensuring the success of both faculty gift giving campaigns. Each homeroom parent will solicit, collect, divide and distribute the faculty Holiday and End of Year Gift. Additional support will be offered as each campaign nears.

3. Coordinating Teacher Appreciation Week. Through collaboration with fellow homeroom families, tokens of appreciation are presented to faculty members each day during the course of one week every May (May 4-8, 2020.) Additional guidelines and suggestions will be forwarded to each homeroom parent as this event nears.
